

Autumn Brilliance Serviceberry

Amelanchier x Grandiflora



Height: 20' to 25'

Width: 15' to 18'

**Minimum Terrace
Width Required:** 54"

Hardiness Zone: 4 to 7

Crown: Ovate, medium fine texture

Foliage: Dark green lustrous leaves, turn brilliant orange to red in fall and persist well.

Flowers: Reliable, abundant white blossoms

Fruit: Abundant fruit is soon consumed by birds

Description: Originated in Illinois and was introduced in 1986. Grows vigorously and develops a moderately spreading branch system.

Advantages: Good growth habit, reliable bloom, and limited size make this tree suitable for many sites where space is limited. Resistant to leaf spot and subsequent defoliation.

Limitations: Presumably the same as other serviceberry hybrids as this cultivar was introduced just recently. Somewhat sensitive to drought, soil compaction, salt, and air pollutants. May be infested by leaf diseases, fireblight, leaf insects, pear slug sawfly, or borers.

Site and Culture: Species information applies. It prefers well drained, moist, acid soils of medium texture. Trees above 1½ " should be transplanted B&B. Recovers slowly after transplanting. Requires little pruning after lower branches have been removed for clearance. Can be grown in containers in the shade.
