

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Mayor John David called the regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Watertown to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 21, 2016, in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

ROLL CALL

Roll call showed the following members present: Alderpersons McFarland, Berg, Larsen, Zgonc, Raether, Tietz, Maron and Romlein. (8) Absent: Smith (1). Also present were Assistant Fire Chief Kraig Biefeld, City Engineer Jaynellen Holloway, City Attorney Will Gruber and Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Elissa Meltesen.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Council recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag.

MINUTES OF PRECEDING MEETING

Mayor David inquired if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the meeting held Tuesday, June 7, 2016. There being none, the minutes were approved as presented.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Mayor David declared open, at 7:02 p.m., a public hearing in the matter regarding a proposed amendment to Section 18.702(10), Widths of Driveways. There being no persons wishing to make comment, Mayor David declared the public hearing closed at 7:03 p.m.

Mayor David declared open, at 7:03 p.m., a public hearing in the matter of a request by ZM Enterprises, LLC to rezone 309 W. Spaulding Street from Planned Business (PB) to General Industrial (GI). Steve Zalewski, petitioner, spoke of the property's history of being zoned light industrial but changing to commercial in the late 1990's or early 2000's pointing out that the property was zoned for industrial or commercial uses prior to the homes being built nearby. Zalewski stated the property has been for sale for eight years and is requesting the zoning change in hopes of attracting a buyer. Zalewski briefly explained some of the allowed uses in the GI zoning classification and gave examples such as office space, indoor maintenance or warehouse businesses. Rick Tortomasi, 315 Creekside Court, is a member of the Plan Commission and Vice President of the Silver Creek Condominium Association and spoke against the proposed rezoning. Tortomasi felt the rezoning request should be put off until there is a clear intent for the future of the property. Joe Ellis, 308 W. Spaulding Street spoke against the proposed rezoning. Ellis said the property has previously been considered for a rezoning and was denied. Ellis stated his concerns are that an industrial use would affect property values and insurance issues for area property owners. Mayor David declared the public hearing closed at 7:13 p.m.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Works Commission, June 14, 2016. 1. Review Ruekert-Mielke estimate to study Storm Water System on Wildflower Lane. Ruekert-Mielke estimated a Capacity Analysis Study would cost \$5,750 and a Storm Sewer Interconnect Design Study would cost from \$7,710 to \$9,655. City staff estimated approximately \$35,000 for new Storm Sewer. Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to reject looking further into this proposal due to the cost. 2. Review Ruekert-Mielke estimate to perform Wetland Delineation on Wildflower Lane. Estimates for a Wetland Delineation Study at 403 Wildflower Lane were received from Wetland and Waterway Consulting for \$4,200 and from Thompson and Associates for \$2,800. Motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously to accept estimate and approve study by Thompson and Associates for \$2,800. 3. Discuss request to drill private well at 1340-1348 N. 4th Street Apartments. Steve Boysa requested a private well to keep retention ponds at an even level. The issue was discussed in October, 2015 by the Commission. Motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously to reaffirm the Commission's opposition to a private well at 1340-1348 N. Fourth Street. 4. Discuss metal detection in parks from Park, Recreation and Forestry

Commission. Street Superintendent Rick Schultz explained city codes do not allow disturbing ground in the parks. It was pointed out that a lot of taxpayer dollars are put into maintaining parks. Metal detecting is allowed in the parks as long as there is no disturbance of the soil while doing so. Motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously to affirm the current ordinances in place. 5. Review and approve removal of east bank lower dam view deck. Engineer Holloway reported the lower dam view deck may be in the way of using a crane for proposed dam repairs. Motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously to refer the potential removal of the viewing deck to the Park, Recreation and Forestry Commission before any further action is taken. 6. Review Ruekert-Mielke proposal to study Lake Victoria and Heiden Pond. Engineer Holloway presented a proposal to do a storm water study involving Lake Victoria and Heiden Pond. Ruekert-Mielke estimated the study would cost \$16,000 to \$19,000. Street Superintendent Rick Schultz supports the objectives of the study but reminded the Commission the Storm Water Utility is currently running at a deficit. Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to recommend this study be funded in the 2017 budget. 7. Review and approve recommendation to stripe bicycle lanes on various streets. The Bicycle and Pedestrian Task Force recommended bicycle lanes be installed on Carriage Hill Drive from West Main Street to Endeavour Drive; Boughton Street from Highway 16 Frontage Road to Labaree Street, North 4th Street from Highway 16 to Hill Street and Highway 16 Frontage Road from North 4th Street to Boughton Street. Superintendent Schultz expressed support for the proposal but noted funds are not currently available for this. Motion was made, seconded and approved unanimously to recommend the striping be funded in the 2017 budget. 8. Review and approve Bicycle and Pedestrian Task Force minutes of May 24, 2016. Motion made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve minutes as presented. 9. Discuss and approve Compliance Maintenance Annual Report (CMAR) for Wastewater Plant. Utility Superintendent Kevin Freber presented a summary of the CMAR explaining the Wastewater Utility achieved high scores in many areas of the report. Freber credited his staff for their achievements and the Commission thanked Freber for his work as well. Motion was made seconded and approved unanimously to approve submission of the CMAR to the DNR.

COMMUNICATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Susan Dascenzo of the Watertown Area Chamber of Commerce addressed the Council. Dascenzo thanked the Leadership Watertown group for their work on the Storybook Trail at Brandt Quirk Park and informed the Council of the new sign at the Chamber office, two new staff members and an upcoming series of seminars on digital marketing and social media for members. Melissa Lampe of the Watertown Main Street Program updated the Council on upcoming events including Rock the River, work on an upcoming promotional booklet and a fundraising campaign to replace the aging Santa house and trailer. Peg Checkai of the Watertown Public Library thanked Leadership Watertown and the Parks Department for their work on the Storybook Trail at Brandt Quirk Park. She added that a new custodian has been hired for the Library and that summer reading programs for adults and children are underway. Checkai also spoke of a small business breakfast series the Library has planned for those interested in learning about starting a small business.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

Certified accounts in the amount of \$391,985.32 were presented for payment. Alderperson Romlein moved to pay all certified accounts, seconded by Alderperson Larsen and carried on a roll call vote: Yes – 8 No – None.
